

The panning demo at St. Serra Fiesta event went very well – panners were given chocolate gold coins as a prize. Tumbleweed announced about – Lost Rios Ranch – Cowboy Days did a panning demonstration – Oak Glen, first weekend in August, - Friday, Sat and Sun. Be sure to plan to attend next year. New Business – New dates for Rendezvous 2018– Oct 26-27-28th – dates are changed due to conflicts. Newsletter will return to print and the deadline will be Sept 3rd. Motion to close, Art F., seconded, Sandy H., meeting ended at 6:45 pm.

Valley Prospectors General Meeting

Meeting was opened at 7:05 pm by President John H. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Courtesy announced 1 guest – Pete Wagner. The Treasurer report followed. Steve S outlined the upcoming Events – Randsburg, Sept 15th, booth setup on how to pan for gold, Thurs, Fri, Sat and Sunday the club will camp on the Burros claims. Rendezvous 2018 has new dates – Oct 26-28, 2018 – Ord Mountain outing. Lots of fun planned. Tonight's Lady Luck has gold equipment available and one very big Zucchini donated by Kent B. (right out of his garden). Membership reported – 306 members of which 16 are lifetime and 1 honorary. Finds of the Month – many entries, please vote. Art F. is interested in purchasing Gold, so that we can offer it at our shows for our panning demonstration. Please contact him is you have some to sell to the club. Library available to members to check out books. Newsletter articles – submit any articles to Art by Sept 3rd. Members can put ads in the newsletter for free for 3 months. Claims – finalizing paper for the county, to be completed by Sept 10th. State Legislature adds a mandatory \$75 fee to file per county. San Bernardino does have an exemption form. Sierra Co also has an exemption form. Kern Co it is still not clear. John H. is following up on this new requirement. John H. also discussed the US Forest Service proposal and update to Fed Regs. End of September the draft should be available. Major revisions are anticipated. Will clarify what is causal use that will not require a plan of operation. May also provide a simplified form of plan of operation form that may not be overrode by local offices. John H. also discussed with the club members about the possibility of acquiring another claim(s) up North. Two adjoining claims – 40 acres and 20 acres – \$7,500 for both (\$5,000 and \$2,500 respectively). On the 40-acre claim, there is an unused BLM campground with parking for 100 vehicles. 
