

Miner's Cookbook Corner: By Judy Carpenter

Pistachio Cake

- 1 yellow cake mix 18-1/4 ounce
- · 4 eggs, slightly beaten
- 1 cup club soda or lemon lime soda
- 1 small box instant pistachio pudding mix (not sugar free)
- 1/4 cup canola, vegetable oil or real butter melted
- 2 cups pistachios, lightly toasted & coarsely chopped
- Frosting-
- 1- 8-ounce tube of Cool whip
- 1 small box of regular (not sugar free) instant pistachio pudding mix
- (optional, add crushed pineapple to your liking)
- if you want it greener add a drop or two of green food coloring
- Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. prepare two 9-inch pans with nonstick cooking spray and parchment paper.
- In a large mixing bowl combine the cake mix, eggs, club soda, 1 box of instant pudding mix and the oil. mix on low speed until dry ingredients are combined then increase speed and beat for 2 mins longer. Stir in nuts but hand until incorporated. Divide cake batter into the 2 9-inch pans and bake for 20 -25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. also the top should spring back when lightly touched. Cool the pans for 10 mins then transfer to cool racks to completely cool. Cakes can be made in advance as the keep well if frozen or at room temperature covered for a couple days.
- Frosting-
- After cakes have cooled, mix cool whip and instant pudding mix together and
- spread in between layers and on top. Garnish with a few more pistachios
