

#### **Camping on Valley Prospector Claims**

Did you know that you can camp on our claims without paying a fee? This is especially helpful at our Northern Claims. However, we have limited sites available. We have no spots at Moriah, you will need to pay and reserve a campsite at the Rocky Rest Campground to be close to the claim. We have three (3) spots for Pickett III / Gold Venture (Union Flats Campground) and two (2) spots at Pickett II (Wild Plum Campground). Our Club Liaison, Stephen Dowling, usually is at the Union Flats Campground during the open season, so only 2 spots may be available. We have implemented a calendar for these sites so that we do not overbook. We had two great outings at Miner's Folly. The membership appreciation picnic was in June and we had about 30 people attend. Great showing in July too! Below are some pictures from the outings.










#### Tim's Annual Outing on the North Yuba 2021

Tim is always ready to give you a friendly "Aloha!"




