

Like the following accounts: The Hotel Jeffery, in Coulterville, Ca; The American River Inn, Georgetown, Ca; and The Marshalls Monument, Coloma, Ca.


P.S. We did find someone squatting on the claim and we notified them that they had to vacate. We were not able to clean up his mess. Steve will follow up with the Sheriff's Office.
