



Heavy Winter Rainstorms Could Mean Great Things for 2023 Prospecting

Heavy rains bring lots of opportunities for new gold movement on our normally dry mountain and desert claims. Water runoff moves gold, much the same way as it moves in rivers and creeks.

Be safe and stay out of washes and gulleys if rain is expected even several miles away. Flash flooding is always a risk and flash floods can occur when the local sky is blue, but it's raining at higher elevations.

After the land dries out, it is a great opportunity to start test pitting to get on the gold again. New deposits may have been exposed through erosion.

Flash Flood Safety Tips

Know before you go if there is a flash flood warning for your area. (remember clear skies do not always mean it is safe!)

Never walk through moving water during a flash flood. Even 6" of rushing water can knock you off your feet.

Never drive through water of unknown depth, even if it looks calm. Flash Floods often cause extreme erosion and can create deep ruts hidden by muddy water.

Flash Floods can start as trickles and become powerful torrents in a matter of seconds. As soon as you see signs, move to higher ground as fast as you can.
