



Volunteers and small gold are always needed for these events. Please reach out to Steve Schubert for more information. Let's work together for future generations.





The claim itself was filled with unique wildflowers and tailing piles. While it is clear that this is a popular area



for prospecting, it has great possibilities for detecting and dry washing. Recently on a nearby claim a kid using a metal detector for the first time found a pinky nail tip-sized nugget during a seeded coin hunt! The area is rife with decomposing granite and unique black rocks, some of which were magnetic and had a deep desert patina on them.

#### ROCKHOUND SOAP BOX

Rockhounding on Public Lands

On February 29, 2024 an email was sent out from the BLM District in El Centro, CA with a new Website for

Recreational Rockhounding on Public Lands. The website includes definitions, FAQ, A Guide to Collecting on Public Lands and Collecting areas in many states.

Take a look at the New BLM Website "Rockhounding on Public Lands" that has just been posted the website contains very good information and the Rockhounding Community needs to engage in a way to take action as to increase the awareness of Recreational Rockhounding on Public Lands!

Checkout the Rockhounding on Public Lands on the right side of the page.

Look at all the states listed there and see if Rockhounding as a recreational activity is listed. If it is, then things are close to being alright. If it is not listed, you need to contact the BLM in your area (State) and ask that it be included. Work with the Land Managers to help insure that the Recreational Rockhound does not go the way of the Passenger Pigeon.

As many Recreational Rockhounds as possible need to do this and make their voices heard by the Land Managers. Recreational Rockhounding needs to be listed as a recognized Recreational Activity in as much detail as reasonable.

This needs to be done on an individual, Club/Society, Regional Federation and National (AFMS) levels. Make the voice of the Recreational Rockhound be heard!

#### **Gold Around the World**

Record Breaking Nugget Went Up for Auction in the UK By M. O'Brien

A whopper of a nugget weighing in at 64.8 grams was found in Britain last year in an area not known to be naturally gold-bearing. A detectorist looking for historical artifacts stumbled onto what is now being called "Hiro's Nugget" in Much Wenlock, Shropshire during a planned group outing. He was late and had to use a detector that was near failing. A bad day turned into nearly \$5,000 dollars in gold at today's rates per gram. As one of the largest gold nuggets ever found in England, it is valued at between £30,000 and £40,000 (roughly \$37,743 to \$50,335) as a specimen.

The big mystery is how and why is was in that location in the first place. The only clues are the remnants of nearby railway tracks built with Welsh stone. Scotland has evidence of gold mining and trade back into the Bronze Age and the Welsh countryside is well known for producing high quality gold. Large nuggets continue to be found even in modern times. A 97.12 gram nugget washed up on the coastline in 2016 and a 121.3 gram nugget, dubbed the "Reunion Nugget," was found in 2019. The theory is that

the nugget hitched a ride in the railroad's stone only to be revealed by time and weathering almost many decades later.

The nugget failed to sell at auction, but it will certainly be the highlight of a collection in the future with an interesting tale to tell. For certain there is a pub with an old detectorist with a whale of a tale of giant gold glinting in the rain soaked meadows of the Shropshire countryside.
